E-Commerce Practicum (218-001): Th 2:30-3:30 pm, 1 credit hour. *Description:* Work with an entrepreneur to help build a real online business. The entrepreneur is Michael Foley, a world-famous chef, who is building a web site devoted in part to mediating the delivery of wine from wholesalers and retailers both nationally and internationally. Students will research the legal issues involved in inter-state and international wine shipping as well as analyze the contractual, privacy, partnership, and other legal issues that arise in running a business of this sort online. Health Care Law: A Strategic Overview (217-071): Tu 4:00-5:50 pm, 2 credit hours. Prof. Joan Lebow. Exam: Wednesday, December 14, 6:00 pm. *Description:* This course, taught by a lawyer with extensive experience in representing health care providers and institutions, introduces the complex health care industry and the legal framework that alternately fosters and

inhibits its progress. The course explores the legal issues raised by the changing relationships among consumers/patients, health care providers, insurance companies, and vendors. It also addresses how courts, legislators, and policymakers respond to the various technologies that power change in the industry. Grading: 70% of the grade will be based on a take-home exam; 20% of the grade will be based on a team project you will report on orally to the class (no written report will be required); 10% of your grade will be based on class participation.
