Exam: Thurs. 5/11 6:00 pm. *Description:* This course will examine a wide range of Critical Race Theory literature ranging from some of the key writings that formed the movement to recent criticism in the area. The course will also explore the relationship between Critical Legal Studies and Critical Race Theory.

**Legal Writing 4: Real Estate/Commercial** (432-011): MW 4:00-5:25 pm, 3 credits. Prof. Brest van Kempen.

**Legal Writing 4: Intellectual Property** (432-054): TTh 6:00-7:25 pm, 3 credits. Prof. Dolan.

both institutions. The course will meet at UIC and will follow the UIC academic schedule (the course will start on January 10 and end on April 27). The course will be graded on the basis of four papers (80%) and class participation (20%). *Description:* Students will become familiar with the primary texts of the Jewish and the Muslim traditions while learning to distinguish between source texts and the history of interpretation. In addition, they will gain skills in textual analysis, legal interpretation, philosophic reading and cultural comparison.
