Legislative Process

Second-year students in the **part-time Day Division** should register for one of the sections of Legislation listed on the first-year Day Division schedule (see previous page).

Legal Writing 3 and Legal Writing 4

Day Division students are required to take Legal Writing 3 and Legal Writing 4 during their second year. **Legal Writing 3** provides an introduction to researching and writing about non-litigation transactional issues and documents, with additional emphasis on oral communication with colleagues and clients. All sections of Legal Writing 3 are offered as General Practice sections. **Legal Writing 4** focuses on advanced research and writing skills in a variety of doctrinal areas and on creating legal instruments common to these areas. All second-year Day Division students were required to take Legal Writing 3 in the Fall semester, except for those who took a Legal Writing 4 Equivalency Class (e.g., certain Law Review students). Students who took an Equivalency Class in the Fall, and deferred Legal Writing 3, must register for Legal Writing 3 in the Spring semester. All other second-year Day Division students must register for Legal Writing 4 in the Spring semester.

** Descriptions of these new sections of Legal Writing 4 are as follows

Federal Indian Law: This section will examine the body of law governing the status of Indian Tribes and their relationship to the federal government with the attendant consequences for the tribes, their members, the states, their citizens, and the federal government; will cover research and written analysis of congressional plenary power of Indian Affairs and present effect on sovereignty, federal trust, jurisdiction, treaty rights, land use, taxation, and gaming.

Comparative Land Transactions: This section will focus on researching, comparing, and writing about land use and development law in the United States and European Union.

Civil Litigation: Environmental and Regulatory: This section will focus on researching and writing about the range of practice issues involved in heavily regulated industries, including not only traditional litigation but also client representation at agencies, advising clients, etc.

Note: Additional sections of both Legal Writing 3 and Legal Writing 4 are listed on the Evening Division schedule.

WHAT EVERY LAWYER SHOULD KNOW ABOUT BUSINESS (1 credit)

This class will provide students with a basic introduction to some of the most important legal and financial subjects that affect businesses, including different types of business entities, securities laws, banking laws, accounting, corporate finance, bankruptcy, and corporate tax. Two hours will be devoted to each subject, and each subject will be taught by a different professor who specializes in the area. The goal of the course is to provide students with basic literacy on these topics. The course is designed for students who would not otherwise enroll in many business-related courses as well as for students who would like a birds-eye overview of these subjects before studying them in detail. The faculty will be Professors Batlan, Birdthistle, Brody, G. Brown, Chapman, P. Hablutzel, and S. Harris.
