#### **Legal Writing 3**

Day Division students who began law school in Fall 2002 or later are required to take Legal Writing 3 and Legal Writing 4 in their second year. Legal Writing 3 provides an introduction to researching and writing about non-litigation oriented transactional issues and documents, with additional emphasis on oral communication with colleagues and clients. All second-year Day Division students (except those enrolled in the Litigation and Alternative Dispute Resolution Program) must register for Legal Writing 3 this semester. These students will then take Legal Writing 4 in the Spring semester. Students who began law school prior to Fall 2002 are not permitted to take Legal Writing 3. These students must read the instructions following the list of Legal Writing 3 courses.

#### **INTENSIVE TRIAL ADVOCACY 1 (3 credit hours)**

Prerequisite: Evidence. Pass/fail not available.

You must take Trial Advocacy 2 in the semester immediately following the Intensive course. Both sessions are considered Fall courses for purposes of tuition and computing Fall grade point averages. However, the Intensive credits will not count as part of your Fall course load for purposes of credit hour limitations. (If taking Intensive Trial Advocacy will put you over the maximum credit limit for your division, please contact the Registrar's office (regq@kentlaw.edu) prior to registering so that your maximum hour limit can be adjusted in the system.)

Both classes will meet from 8:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. each day, <u>including the intervening Sunday</u>. If you enroll in the course and later decide not to take it, you must drop it by Friday, May 23 (Session 1) or Friday, September 5 (Session 2), or <u>you will be charged full tuition for the course</u> unless another student takes your seat.

**Note to Evening Division students**: If Intensive Trial Advocacy brings your total credit hours for the Fall semester to at least 12, you will automatically be billed for student health insurance unless you waive coverage; instructions for waiving coverage appear in the Registration Bulletin.

## **CLINICAL EDUCATION COURSES**

Permission is required for admission to all clinical programs. The Pre-Trial Litigation and Business Entity Formation classes are graded classes. All in-house and externship clinical programs are graded on a pass/low pass/fail basis only. Students are expected to put in a minimum of 224 hours (an average of 32 hours a week for 7 weeks) for 4 hours of credit, a minimum of 168 hours (an average of 24 hours a week for 7 weeks) for 3 hours of credit, and a minimum of 112 hours (an average of 16 hours a week for 7 weeks) for 2 hours of credit. Students must be available at the days and times designated below to meet with supervising attorneys and at other times as required by the supervising attorneys.
