This course is concerned primarily with the rights of creditors and debtors under the federal Bankruptcy Code, with particular emphasis on the fundamental concepts of bankruptcy law.

The casebook is **TABB & BRUBAKER, BANKRUPTCY LAW** (2d ed. 2006). You also will use the 2008 Casebook Supplement, which is available for download on the web page for this course, as well as your own copy of the Bankruptcy Code. I have asked the bookstore to stock **U.S. BANKRUPTCY CODE & RULES BOOKLET** (2009 ed.).
