Ms. Zuo practices in Shanghai Li Guoji Law Firm, which was founded in 1988 and was the first private law firm in China's history. This firm was also in the lawyer's recommendation lists of Australian and New Zealand's Consulate. As a litigation lawyer, Ms. Zuo devotes herself to both domestic and foreign-related civil suits of family law, employment and labor law, personal injury and pro bono cases. She also provided legal service for small enterprises and businesses as legal consultant. Previous to being a lawyer at Li Guoji Law Firm, she was in-house legal personnel of a subsidiary company to a large real estate holding company in Hong Kong.

Ms. Zuo obtained her bachelor's degree of law at East China University of Politics and Law in 2003. She also served as a secretary of a student association. In her second year at law school, she participated in Shanghai Symposium on China's Property Law Legislation as a student representative. In 2001, she attended a hearing meeting on drafting of Shanghai Employment Agreement Regulation held by Shanghai Municipal People's Congress. Before coming to Chicago Ms. Zuo was earning her Judicial Master's degree in Science of Law as a part-time student at Fudan University. She is currently pursuing an LL.M. in International and Comparative Law at Chicago-Kent College of Law.

Ms. Zuo is licensed to practice in China, and is a member of the Shanghai Bar Association and China's Bar Association. She was invited to be a guest host for a legal consultant show on the radio in Shanghai. She was also a volunteer lawyer in two communities, providing legal service for residents. Ms. Zuo has published two essays regarding civil cases in a legal column of Xinmin Evening News, which is the biggest news service in Shanghai. Finally, one of her cases was selected to be included in a collection of cases published by *Shanghai Legal Daily*. Ms. Zuo speaks Mandarin and English.
